6. ACCIDENTAL RELEASE MEASURES

Emergency Procedures

Prevent product from escaping to drains and waterways. Contain leaking packaging in a containment drum. Prevent vapours or dusts from building up in confined areas. Ensure that drain valves are always closed. Clean up and report spills immediately.

7. HANDLING AND STORAGE

Precautions for Safe Handling

This product will decompose at extremely high temperatures (> 500°C) forming carbon (dust). Otherwise the product will melt (> 60°C) and will be slippery at high temperatures. Wear PPE for product in use at elevated temperatures.

Conditions for Safe Storage

Store in a cool, dry place away from direct sunlight. Protect containers from physical damage and check regularly for leaks. Avoid release to waterways, store in bunded areas and ensure exit drains are closed. Product will be slippery if spilt.
